- ☐ Blocks: Fifty-two 2 1/2" squares (Suggest light and medium values)
- Blocks: Twelve 4 1/2" squares of a background fabric (One and a half 4 1/2" strips WOF, or may be scrappy)
- ☐ Inner Border: Four 1 ½" strips WOF (Three if the useable fabric is at least 41" wide)
- Outer Border: Forty-eight 2 1/2" squares
- ☐ Binding: Three 2 1/4"" strips WOF
- □ Backing & Batting: 29" x 29"



- □ Sew the medium and light 2 1/2" squares together into thirteen four patch units.
- ☐ The four patch unit should measure 4 1/2" square.
- using your favorite appliqué method, appliqué the selected design to as many of the background fabric squares as you choose.
- Arrange the background fabrics squares alternating with the four patch units into five rows of five blocks.
- Sew the four patch units and background fabric squares into rows.
- Sew the rows together.
- \Box The top should now measure 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Applique All Over:



☐ Sew on the 1 1/2" strips for the inner border.

Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ border squares into four rows with 11 squares in each row.

☐ These rows should be 20 1/2" long.

 $f \square$ Add a 'cornerstone' square to each end of two of the rows.

☐ Attach the pieced borders to the quilt top.

 \Box The top should now measure 26 $^{1/2}$ " x 26 $^{1/2}$ ".

☐ Layer with batting and backing and quilt.

☐ Put on the binding and label.
